Our Week of Learning

Language Arts: We are learning our subject pronouns and possessive pronouns as well as the quirky rhyming poem "*The Rhinoceros*."

Latin: This week in Latin, we practiced first declension noun endings and learned new vocabulary words. We are beginning to understand how to identify the gender of a noun in Latin. Latin nouns are assigned genders that sometimes reflect their physical gender but otherwise simply serve a grammatical function. For example, the Latin word for "tree" (arbor) is masculine, while the Latin word for "oak tree" (quercus) is feminine.

Literature: Review vocabulary and spelling nightly. **History:** We are explorers of mountains in this exciting unit! While memorizing ranges and highest peaks by continents, we are also thinking critically about how mountains have both challenged and benefited mankind.

Science: Your children are studying volcanoes including Mt. Vesuvius, Krakatoa, and Mt. St. Helens. Be on the lookout for information about an optional extra-credit volcano project and expect a test over lessons 1-5 next week.
