Academic Highlights

- The Class of 2019, with 66 graduates, earned \$8,328,541 in scholarships.
- Sophmore Adele (AC) Wilson) was one of 47 2018/2019 Classic Learning Test 10 National Reward Recipients. These top performers scored within the top 1% of all test takers in the nation and are eligible for a one-time, \$2,500 scholarship, to any participating CLT partnercollege.
- The Senior Capstone presentations are always a highlight. These presentations represent the synthesis of the student's learning in response to the question "How does one live well?" Congratulations to the 2019 finalists and winner Alix Walters!
 Seventh grader Connor Sherrow
- scored a 1200 on his SAT's after taking the junior high DukeTIPS elective.

Organizational Highlights

- U.S. News and World Report ranked The Vanguard School #1 in Colorado Springs and #3 in Colorado.
- Ranked by Niche as the #1 Charter High School, Junior High, and Elementary School in Colorado Springs.
- The Colorado Department of Education bestowed multiple awards on The Vanguard School in 2018-2019. The high school, junior high, and elementary school all were awarded the John Irwin School of Excellence Award. The high school also received The Governor's Distinguished Improvement Award for "exceptional student growth." Additionally, the high school was the only school in all of Colorado Springs and El Paso County to win the High School Academic Growth Award.
- The Class of 2020 scored an average of 27 on the ACT and 1218 on the SAT during their junior year. Collectively, 14% of the class earned recognition through the National Merit Scholarship program.
- Sixty-six students took 138 Advanced Placement exams in the Spring of 2019. The percentage of total AP students with scores of 3 or higher (on a 1 to 5 scale) was 90%. American colleges generally grant placement and course credit to students who obtain scores of 3 or higher on exams.
 - The Vanguard School was ranked fourth in the nation by the Classic Learning Test for rigor and high performance of secondary students.

Athletic Highlights

- The high school boys club volleyball team won their fourth consecutive State Championship.
- The high school boys basketball team finished second in the state 3A tournament and completed the team's best season ever.
- Seth Fuqua joined the ranks of the elite becoming the third highest scorer in the history of Colorado high school basketball, and one of only 12 individuals to have ever reached 2,000 points. He finished his high school career with 2,374 points.
- The junior high girls basketball team finished the 2018-2019 season undefeated (32-0).
 Vanguard sixth grader Lorenzo Bustamante (11 years old) placed first in his age range for the Knights of Columbus State Free Throw Championship.

Arts and Extracurricular Highlights

- Our Team America Rocketry Club (TARC) students traveled to Virginia to compete in the national tournament. Our team was one of only two clubs in Colorado that qualified to compete at the national level in 2019.
- Vanguard's Global Studies Program took trips abroad to the northern Mediterranean coast and to Costa Rica.
- The fall musical, "110 in the Shade," was a phenomenal showing of talent. Senior Hans Mueh is now studying musical theatre in NYC.
- The award-winning Forensics Team (Speech and Debate) had two individuals who were invited to participate in the national competitions in Dallas, Texas. Both placed in the top 20% in the nation.

In the 2018-2019 school year, Vanguard high school and junior high art students won a National Gold Medal, a National Silver Medal, and eight statechampionship Gold Key awards at the Colorado Scholastic Art Awards. Vanguard art students also won three awards at the Fifth Congressional Art Competition and nine awards at the Young Peoples Art Exhibition. Additionally, junior Alyssa Jimeson won her third consecutive National Award making her the most decorated young artist in our school's history.




Finance Report

Notable Capital Projects:

- The Vanguard School undertook several significant capital improvement projects during the 2018-2019 school year. Security cameras were installed in all building interiors to provide visibility of student common areas helping to increase safety and security across both campuses. A major portion of funding for this project was provided by a donor whose son works at the school and whose grandchild attends Vanguard.
- The school also was able to repair the roofs on every building, except the newly opened Dome, through a combination of insurance claims and a BEST (Building Excellent Schools Today) Grant. In total, the school received over \$1.6 million in funding to support these improvements that will extend the lifetime of our facilities for many years to come.



- During the 2018-2019 school year, 18% of Vanguard families qualified for free or reduced lunch.
- During the 2019-2020 school year, 22% of Vanguard families qualify for free or reduced lunch.

Beginning in Kindergarten, students are mastering cursive, which stimulates the development of fine motor skills and reinforces the blending of sounds within words. In fourth grade, students begin the study of Latin, which improves their vocabulary and ability to think logically.

Students are continually challenged to reach their potential through achievement level grouping and content-rich curriculum and are exposed to a coherent, incremental, and knowledge-based curriculum utilizing Direct Instruction methodology and the Core Knowledge® Sequence. This sequence is intended to help children establish a strong foundation of knowledge necessary to master the content in junior high, high school, and beyond.

The school's focus on character is just as essential as our academics, and in elementary, we focus on The Keys to Success: Citizenship, Respect, Integrity, Self-Discipline, and Excellence. To celebrate our students' exemplary character, we proudly award quarterly "Pure Grit Awards" to students who embody these traits.




