



Basic Standard of Appearance Guidelines for All Students

- Apparel advertising tobacco, alcohol, illegal substances, and/or offensive slogans is not acceptable attire at school or school-sponsored activities. Clothes making statements with sexual innuendoes are not allowed.
- The wearing of clothing, jewelry or a style of grooming that is identified with membership in a gang will not be tolerated in school or at any school-sponsored activity. Apparel that interferes with or endangers self or others while participating in school or school-sponsored activities is not allowed.
- Clothing must be clean, pressed, and free of holes, tears, and frays.
- Dress will not be worn that causes or is likely to cause the disruption of the educational process.
- The final decision as to the safety or suitability of the clothing, hair, or jewelry will be left up to the principal or designee.
- No denim, camouflage, or leather material allowed (exception is Vanguard letterman jackets).

Hair

- Hair must be clean, neat, and styled traditionally. Only natural colors are allowed. No unusual or radical hairstyles (such as extreme undercuts).
- Hair should not be longer than top of shirt collar or hang in the eyes.
- No ponytails.
- No hair accessories, pins, or hair ties are allowed.
- No facial hair is allowed.

Jewelry

- Modest jewelry is allowed.
- An object that has a purpose other than jewelry cannot be worn as jewelry (i.e., chains or collars).
- No more than three necklaces may be worn at one time and must not be outside the shirt.
- Three bracelets per wrist.
- Three rings per hand.
- Earrings will not be worn.

Tattoos and Body Piercing

- Tattoos must be covered at all times.
- No intentionally created marks should be visible on the skin.
- No pierced jewelry may be worn.
- No body art, including drawing or writing on skin made by the student with a writing utensil.

Pants

- No jeans, denim, or leather of any type or color. No faux blue jeans.**
- Pants must fit the waistline and not sag in the crotch.
- The cuff of the pants may not touch the ground, but must touch the top of the shoe.
- No oversized pants. Pants may not be so large that the shoelaces cannot be seen.
- Pants may not be excessively tight or show any descriptive lines of the body (not skin-tight).
- Sweatpants, warm-ups, pajama pants, and jersey (t-shirt) fabric pants are not allowed.
- May be one solid color, striped, plaid, (e.g. no camouflage) without screen printing or faded areas.
- Pants must be in good repair.

Shorts

- No jeans, denim, or leather of any type or color.**
- Shorts must fit the waistline and not sag in the crotch.
- The cuff of the shorts must be at maximum 2 inches from the top of the kneecap.
- Spandex or tightly fitting shorts are not allowed.
- No athletic shorts.
- May be one solid color, striped, or plaid, (e.g. no camouflage) without screen printing.

Shirts

- Shirts must have collars and be buttoned to the mid-sternum. No undershirt designs may be visible.
- Sweaters must have a collar or be worn over a collared shirt or under a blazer.
- All shirt collars are to be folded down.
- No shirts that are excessively tight or baggy; no holes or tears.

- Shirts must have sleeves.
- For shirts not tucked in, the tails may not hang below the crotch. Longer shirts must be tucked in.

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Shirts, cont.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Patterned shirts are allowed; shirts with screen printing are not allowed.•Any logos or sewn words must be on the front in the upper corner near the shoulder. No large logos across the chest are allowed.• Hooded clothing of any kind is not allowed.
Outerwear	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Outerwear (i.e., coats, jackets, hoodies, hats, scarves, or gloves) shall be removed when entering the building.•Vanguard letterman jackets may be worn in the building as well as Vanguard spirit wear that has a collar and is quarter-zip (not to include windbreaker-type jackets).• Fleece collared outerwear that has a quarter-zip may also be worn.
Undergarments	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•No undergarments may show at any time, nor should they be worn as outer garments.
Hats and Sunglasses	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•May only be worn outside of the building.•Sunglasses may not be worn on the head.•Hats include visors and bandannas.
Shoes	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Required at all times.•Athletic sandals with a heel strap (such as Chacos) may be worn•No slippers, flip flops, slides, Croc-style or Birkenstock-style sandals•No writing on shoes.•Shoelaces must match.
Cross-dressing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Clothing and jewelry must be gender appropriate.
Physical Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Separate attire should be used for P.E., including athletic shoes and socks. (See P.E. syllabus)
Vanguard Sportswear	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Vanguard sportswear (team windbreakers, sweatshirts, etc.) may be worn at specific times with prior approval from the principal.

A Student not adhering to dress code will not be allowed to attend class until he is wearing proper attire.

The final decision as to the safety or suitability of any dress code issue will be left up to the principal or designee.



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- The wearing of clothing, jewelry or a style of grooming that is identified with membership in a gang will not be tolerated in school or at any school-sponsored activity. Apparel that interferes with or endangers self or others while participating in school or school-sponsored activities is not allowed.
- Clothing must be clean, pressed, and free of holes, tears, and frays.
- Dress will not be worn that causes or is likely to cause the disruption of the educational process.

- No denim, camouflage, or leather material allowed (exception is Vanguard letterman jackets).

Hair

- Hair must be clean, neat, and styled traditionally. Only one natural base color and one natural-looking highlight color are allowed. No unusual or radical hairstyles (such as undercuts or partially-shaved hair styles).

Jewelry

- Modest jewelry is allowed.
- An object that has a purpose other than jewelry cannot be worn as jewelry (i.e., animal chains/collars).
- No more than three necklaces may be worn at one time.
- No more than three bracelets may be worn on each wrist.
- No more than three rings may be worn on each hand.
- Only single-post or hook earrings are allowed. Earrings are limited to three per ear and must not be oversized. Earcuffs, bars, gauges, or gauge-like earrings are not allowed.

Tattoos and Body Piercing

- Tattoos must be covered at all times.
- No intentionally created marks should be visible on the skin.
- No pierced jewelry other than earrings may be worn.
- No body art, including drawing or writing on skin made by the student with a writing utensil.

Makeup and Nail Polish

- Makeup must look natural. There are to be no unusual or distracting colors, such as black lipstick.
- Nail polish (to exclude black) is acceptable. No extreme nail patterns or decorations, including jewels and initials shall be worn.

Pants

- Pants may not be excessively baggy or tight, showing any descriptive lines of the body (not skin-tight).**
- No jeans, denim, or leather of any type or color. No faux blue jeans.**
- Pants must fit the waistline or low waist. Ultra low-rise waistlines are not allowed.
- Leggings and tight-fitting stretch-pants may not be worn as pants.
- Sweatpants, warm-ups, pajama pants, casual banded pants, and jersey (t-shirt) fabric pants are not allowed.
- May be one solid color, striped, plaid, or a subtle, classic pattern without screen printing or faded areas.
- Pants must be in good repair.

Shorts and Skorts

- No jeans, denim, or leather of any type or color.**
- Shorts must fit the waistline or low-waist. Ultra low-rise waistlines are not allowed.
- The cuff of the shorts cannot be shorter than 2 inches above the kneecap when standing.
- Shorts may not be excessively tight or show any descriptive lines of the body (not skin-tight).
- Spandex or tight-fitting stretch-shorts are not allowed.
- No athletic shorts.
- May be one solid color, striped, or plaid, without screen printing or faded areas.

Skirts, Dresses, Jumpers

- No denim or leather.**
- Dresses must cover at least 2 inches of the shoulder.
- Skirts, dresses, and jumpers may not be excessively tight or show any descriptive lines of the body (not skin-tight).

Skirts, Dresses, Jumpers, cont.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Skirts, dresses, and jumpers cannot be shorter than 2 inches above the kneecap while standing and may not touch the ground.•Pantyhose, leggings, and tights may be worn under a skirt or dress that otherwise falls within the dress code.•Pantyhose, leggings, and tights worn in this manner must be skin-tone, solid color, or a classic pattern. Classic patterns are stripes, plaid, and houndstooth.•Pantyhose, leggings, and tights must be free from runs, rips, and holes.•Stockings or socks above-the-knee are not allowed.•No fish-net style stockings or other hosiery that exposes skin may be worn.
Shirts, Sweaters, Sweatshirts	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Shirts may not be excessively tight or baggy, and all shirts with buttons must be buttoned to the mid-sternum.•Sleeveless blouses are allowed. At least 2 inches of the shoulder must be covered.•No tank tops, spaghetti straps, strapless tops, one-shoulder tops, or t-shirts may be worn as a primary (top) shirt. T-shirts include athletic, screen-printed, basic crew neck, scoop neck, or v-neck tees.•Cotton shirts with an embellishment such as ruffles, gathering, a scarf, etc.(not simply pockets or cuffs) that makes them like a blouse may be worn as a primary shirt.•A tank top, spaghetti strap top, or basic solid-colored tee may be worn with a blouse, sweater, or blazer over it.•Bra straps must not be visible either directly or through lace or other sheer material.•No low cut apparel of any kind is allowed. Cleavage should never be visible.•No midriff shirts. No skin on the torso should be visible below the bottom of the shirt.•Any logos or sewn words must be on the front in the upper corner near the shoulder. No large logos across the chest are allowed.•Hooded clothing of any kind is not allowed.
Outerwear	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Outerwear (i.e., coats, jackets, hoodies, hats, winter scarves, or gloves) shall be removed inside the building.<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Vanguard letterman jackets may be worn in the building as well as Vanguard spirit wear that has a collar (not to include windbreaker-type jackets).• Fleece collared outerwear that has a quarter-zip may also be worn.
Undergarments	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•No undergarments may show at any time, nor should they be worn as outer garments.•Appropriate undergarments must be worn.
Hats and Sunglasses	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•May only be worn outside of the building.•Sunglasses may not be worn on the head.•Hats include visors and bandannas.
Shoes	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Required at all times.•Athletic sandals with a heel strap (such as Chacos) may be worn•No slippers, flip flops, or Croc-style or Birkenstock-style sandals.•No writing on shoes.•Shoelaces must match.•3.5-inch maximum heel height.•Boots must stay below the knee.
Cross-dressing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Clothing and jewelry must be gender appropriate.
Physical Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Separate attire should be used for P.E., including athletic shoes and socks. (See P.E. syllabus)
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
